
Chestnut class have been helping take care of Piglet, the school dog.

I am Sharon the Family Liaison Officer/Lead Thrive Practitioner at Kestrel House School. I started this role at the beginning of January. I have been working on engaging with the families and doing joined up work with the families and school. I have completed home visits with individual families and liaised with their local councils and social workers in order to get the families the support that they need.

I have started up a parent group which is called Kestrel Family Nest where I run support sessions for families. These sessions are designed so that the families can build up relationships and support each other as well as our school supporting them. I have also introduced the families to other members of the well-being team. Simon Mendoza Well-being Co-ordinator has done a Makaton session with the families and has given out little hand books that we have made.

In my next session which will be after the Easter break I will be working with the speech and language therapist to do a PECS and time-table session for the Kestrel Family Nest group.
