Angel Class

During Spring Term, we have been delving into the theme 'An Inspector Calls' through interactive, sensory and creative based activities. We took part I science experiments, nature walks, songs and sensory play.

In Science we have been investigating the cause and effect of mixing different materials together. One of our experiments included: baking soda, vinegar and food colouring. The learners used the green and red strip to complete the experiment. We started by adding baking soda to a tray, then we mixed food colouring and vinegar into a bowl, we used syringes to add the food colouring and vinegar to the baking soda. The learners were fascinated by hearing the fizzing sound.









We have been having fun doing sensory and creativity play. In our Inspectors topic, we got to paint tour hands and feet to make prints.



We had loads of fun in messy play exploring different materials. We choose our own materials and mixed them together. We were able to see and feel the changes in the materials, like when we mixed the foam and water with cotton wool.







In literacy, learners have enjoyed reading The Three Little Pigs sensory story we did role-play and explore the different materials that were used to build the three houses. Children were also able to explore their forces by 'blowing' down the houses and exploring why some materials were stronger than others.























Hampstead class

Hampstead class have been working really hard this term and most importantly having lots of fun!

In Numeracy this term, we have been learning about our numbers 1-10 and the quantity of each amount







In Literacy, we have been studying The Tiger Who Came to Tea by Judith Kerr. We have been using our interactive whiteboard to remember parts of the story including verbs. We have also been writing our names and shopping list items like

"milk" and "juice" and "walk".








In Science, we have been investigating using a straw for the technique of sucking and blowing. We have used a straw to suck up drinks like water, milk or fruit juice and we have blown cotton across our table.











Paddington Class

Paddington class have been working hard this term. This term our topic has been 'An Inspector Calls''

In Literacy we have been using our detective skills and magnifying glasses to find objects around School





For creativity we have been making our own habitats out of boxes, paint, and different materials such as cotton wool, leaves and glitter. We have also been watching videos about different animals and the habitats they live in.









This term Paddington have been going rock climbing at the Castle to work on our mobility skills and to also introduce a new activity in PE. Paddington have enjoyed exploring the castle, looking at the different colourful rock designs, and climbing to the top and swinging down.









Victoria Class

Victoria class have been having lots of fun this term being detectives. We have been working on being more indipendant. We have been exploring and investigating different objects and materials throught our lessons.











We have been finding new ways to create art masterpieces. We don't just use paintbrushes in Victoria class for our art, we use sponges, elastic bands, pipettes and best of all our hands!



In maths we have been sorting and matching colours. We have also been exploring big and small using big and small pancakes.













To help with our independence we have been working on our self-care with some support from our adults and our green and red strips. We have been working on brushing our teeth, our toilet routine and keeping our environment clean.

























Waterloo Class

Throughout the spring term, Waterloo Class have opened a weekly shop; to make and sell small healthy snacks to the rest of the school on Friday afternoons. They have been making shopping lists, buying ingredients and following recipes for the different snacks. Some of the learners in Waterloo class have stated that they might like to work in a shop when they are older, so we see this as a great chance for them to engage in some simple work experience.









Waterloo Class have been trying lots of new things this term; we have been helping the learners to try new skills, helping them to tell us more about what they like and dislike, and giving them opportunities to have more unique experiences in the wider community. This term we have been visiting the Emirates Stadium. The learners really enjoyed using local buses on their journey, and exploring the grounds around the stadium.

Pimlico class have been practising life skills in the classroom and in our cooking sessions. We like to clean up using the broom, hoover and wiping the tables and the big white board.








We have done lots of nice trips out in the community such as going on the bus, going to the park, and going to the shops.

Life Skills

Occupational Therapy

The Occupational Therapist (OT) has continued to deliver therapy at a Specialist level (1:1 therapy sessions) Enhanced level (individual programmes and small therapy groups) and a Universal level (whole school/class strategies and approaches)

Specialist Input:

This has continued to include specialist work using our school swing and soft play room. For some of our learners, swing sessions can provide important opportunities to bring the body into different positions, regulate the senses, engage in meaningful social interactions through games and songs and work on postural control and strength.





It has also included supporting teachers to ensure writing goals and other curriculum goals are as meaningful as possible

Enhanced Input:

In our OT/Education blended group learning sessions, we have continued work around self-care skills as part of the PSHE curriculum. We aim to ensure that this work is meaningful and motivating, with some of our learners following individual OT programmes to help them to brush and style their own hair in their favourite styles. We will also be learning about our friend Annie and how she dresses herself during future sessions in the Spring Term-through a series of stories.


















Universal Input:

The learners came in groups and used premade PECs symbols to request the food that they wanted (some of which was kindly donated by our lovely parents) and they all sat around on tables colouring in and tracing over Chinese letters. Traditional music was played throughout the afternoon and learners were encouraged to try new foods from different cultures.















Wild Science

With school visits opening back up, we decided to bring back an old favourite, Wild Science! The visit allowed our students to interact with various animals over the course of the morning. The children loved stroking the animals and feeling the various textures that each animal had. The company brought a guinea



pig, hamster, snake, land snail and millipede for our learners to look at and stroke. We provided PECs symbols for our learners so they were able to identify each animal and even request certain animals. It was invaluable experience for the learners and some pupils even found comfort in stroking the animals (even if the staff didn't). We can't wait to make this a recurring event here at Kestrel.

own flags and rainbow's using a variety of crafty mediums whilst




Autism Acceptance Day
