International Woman's Day and Chinese New Year was celebrated with our arts and crafts!






Oh, and we also love to clean up our room!!!!

We have been taking weekly trips to Stationers Park, which all the learners look forward to, and we hope to go more once the weather picks up.












Paddington Class

We have been missing our learners here at Kestrel and we are pleased to have a full class again. We are so proud of our learners doing their work at home.




In Literacy, we have been using colourful semantics to retell parts of different sensory stories. We have also been learning to write captions from stories as well as our names.

Occupational Therapy

'During the pandemic we have continued to explore the use of Yoga with certain individuals as part of their OT provision at Kestrel House School. This is to help them to feel relaxed and regulated during school; learning meaningful new motor skills sequences and calming techniques through this powerful practice. This has been through 1:1 and group sessions led by the OT, and some of the teachers have also started to integrate Yoga practice into their timetables in the morning or throughout the day to promote a 'just right' level of arousal and a sense of well-being for the learners.

Next steps will include increasing the amount of groups the OT offers as part of the week; so that more learners who really benefit from Yoga can have access it. It will also include finding ways to embed breathing and yoga posture practice into the day with the teachers. Furthermore, the OT will be putting some helpful Yoga practice tutorials to follow at home on the school website under 'OT TV' so that parents can try out some of this at home!'













Speech and Language





This term the Speech and Language Therapist has been supporting the learners with understanding and learning new vocabulary relating to seasonal events e.g. Spring, Valentine's Day, Pancake Tuesday and Easter. The learners have been accessing stories which are broken down using colourful semantics to simplify the language and teach new characters, people's names, verbs and vocabulary.

The Speech and Language Therapist has also provided SCERTs training for the whole staff team over 6 sessions. The whole team has now received SCERTs training and participated in the relevant assessments throughout the course. We have started to make plans to further implement the SCERTs model throughout the school.
