Angel Class

Literacy

In Literacy this term, Angel class have been reading lots of sensory stories such as the Halloween story, Christmas story, Aquarium story and the Where are you from story. Each story has different sensory inputs for touch, sound and sight allowing the pupils to improve on their sensory processing. We have also been practicing phonics, writing and fine motor skills.





Numeracy

During Numeracy lessons, Angel class have been discovering numbers and different sizes. We have been learning this through more sensory stories such as Goldilocks and the three bears and the Hungry caterpillar story, as well as during cooking lessons.



Science

In Science we have been learning about different groups of animals. We have been exploring this through bucket activities, creativity and art.



Trips Out

Angel class have taken many different trips out this term, helping to develop the pupils social and emotional health. We have visited places like the park, tennis, the farm and the aquarium.



Victoria Class

Within **Literacy**, pupils developed key literacy skills by interacting and engaging with stories such as *A Squash* and a Squeeze, Farmer Duck and Kipper's Snow Day.

Through sensory exploration and hands-on activities,

pupils engaged with the characters, settings, and events, building their





understanding through repetition, visual cues, and actions.

The focus was on creating meaningful interactions with the texts, fostering early literacy skills such as

listening, comprehension, mark making, tracing and communication in a supportive and engaging environment.



Numeracy stories have played a pivotal role in introducing early numeracy skills to pupils throughout the autumn term, particularly in helping them develop counting skills up to 5. Through engaging stories, pupils were encouraged to count objects and characters, reinforcing their understanding of numbers in a fun and

contextual way.

This learning was further supported through Attention Autism sessions,

which used visual and interactive activities to capture pupils' attention and promote active participation in counting and number recognition.

Additionally, various craft activities, such as creating number-based art and craft projects, provided a hands-on approach to numeracy, allowing pupils to explore



numbers in a creative and meaningful context, strengthening their counting skills and number comprehension.



Pupils deepened their understanding of farms and animals in **science** through a variety of engaging, sensory-rich activities. They explored different animals, using sensory experiences such as touching animal textures, listening to animal sounds, and observing visual

aids to help them connect with the creatures they studied.

Crafts provided an additional hands-on approach, allowing pupils to create

animal models and farm scenes, reinforcing their learning in a fun and interactive way.

Attention Autism sessions further supported this exploration by using focused activities that captured the pupils' attention and encouraged participation,



enabling them to learn about farm animals in an engaging and immersive environment.

Pupils explored a variety of seasonal celebrations, including Halloween, Black History Month, Remembrance Day, and Christmas. These events provided rich opportunities for learning about different cultures, traditions, and historical significance.



For Black History Month, pupils participated in a music



and dance celebration, where they accessed and engaged with cultural expressions through movement, fostering a deeper understanding of Black heritage.

During Halloween, pupils enjoyed sensory activities, crafts, and storytelling. As Christmas approached, pupils engaged in festive crafts and songs, further enhancing their understanding of the season's traditions. These

celebrations allowed pupils to connect with a range of cultural and historical topics in an interactive and meaningful way.

Literacy/phonics


This term Pimlico class have been learning several new sounds in phonics. The class have been enjoying the Christmas themed phonics.

Westminster Class







This term in Westminster Class, we've been learning about farm animals and enjoying our sensory story *A Squash and A Squeeze* by Julia Donaldson. We've also been creating our own music sessions, which everyone has been enjoying. Most recently, we've been busy making Christmas cards for every classroom in the school.







Paddington Class

Paddington Class has had a fantastic Autumn Term filled with exciting learning experiences and meaningful activities. Our students have worked incredibly hard, developing their skills, achieving their targets, earning AQA awards. Highlights of their term include weekly cooking sessions, where we prepared delicious healthy recipes, and our community walks, which helped us practice numeracy skills in real world settings like local shops. Fridays are always a treat with our games club, cinema time, offering opportunities for relaxation, fun, and social interaction. Alongside these activities, we celebrated birthdays and special events, it has been a joyful and productive term for everyone in Paddington Class.

In English, we have enjoyed exploring books such as "Where are you from?" and "Coming to England, which have sparked meaningful discussions and learning. Through comprehension and matching activities based on the books, the children have been developing their typing and writing skills. They have also learnt about their own likes and dislikes, the richness of their culture and embraced their own uniqueness like the characters in the stories we have read. We have also practiced tracing letters helping to improve fine motor skills and letter formation. Our morning phonics sessions have been great opportunity to build confidence and language skills. Each day, we go around the group and ask the children to say a word beginning with the phonetic letter we are learning that morning, which has been fun and interactive way to develop phonemic awareness. Group games and activities have been another highlight, allowing the children to engage in collaborative learning. Reading sessions have been both relaxing and interactive, with students enjoying stories and even participating interactive activities. It has been a wonderful to see progress in both literacy and their love for books.



In Maths, we have been engaging in a variety of fun and practical activities to develop key skills. The children have worked on weights, measuring and ordering different heights and lengths, as well as improving their counting abilities. Weekly trips to the shops have been a highlight, where the children practiced money skills by handing over cash to the cashier. Or assisting an adult at the self-service tills. They particularly enjoyed using their own shopping lists, finding items, and placing them in the basket, which helped build independence and confidence. In the classroom, we have focused on activities such as matching numbers with their corresponding visuals and words to strengthen recognition and understanding. It has been fantastic to see their skills and confidence grow through these interactive and meaningful maths activities.



In Science, we have been learning about lots of different things and doing lots of fun experiments and group work. We have been learning about different animals and habitats. We have also explored nature on science walks, collecting leaves for fun and educational projects. These activities have sparked curiosity, encouraged problem solving, and provided plenty of opportunities for the learners to engage in sensory and practical learning it has been a fantastic term full of discovery and exploration.



In Art, the children have had a creative and hands on term, exploring a variety of fun and meaningful projects. For Black History Month, we enjoyed a carnival workshop where the children expressed themselves through beautiful crafts, colourful clothing and dance. We baked cakes and made Pudsey Bear has to share in our Paddington class Shop for Children In Need. The children also engaged in sensory storytelling and created spooky art Halloween, which they thoroughly enjoyed and engaged in. We made colourful and vibrant Diyas for Diwali, and as the term has progressed, we embraced the festive spirit with beautiful winter crafts for Christmas.



During our RSE and PHSE sessions, we have been learning safe and unsafe people, body parts, emotions, understanding body boundaries, personal space, and safe touch. We have also explored topics like unsafe secrets while developing self-care, independence and life skills such as using deodorant and hairdressing. These lessons are reinforced daily through our interactions and familiar songs, helping students build confidence and integrate these concepts into their daily lives. We have been delighted to see the children identify their likes and dislikes, understand the difference between public and private spaces, and recognise who their safe people are at home and in the wider community.



Hampstead Class

Literacy

In literacy Hampstead class have been learning phonic sounds. We have been learning the sounds *S*, *A*, *T*, *P*, *I*, *N*, *M*. We have also been enjoying reading time.



Numeracy

In Numeracy we have been recognising numbers and looking at small, medium and large. We have enjoyed using the story of Goldilocks and the Three bears.

PSHE

In PSHE we have been looking at recognising our feelings. We Use a feelings board to check in how we feel before the start of each lesson, and we have been matching and making facial expressions.

We have been learning about different careers and looking at how vets help animals.

In RSE We have also been learning about our private areas on our body being private, the changes in our body and staying safe.

Waterloo Class

Waterloo class have had a brilliant term filled with lots of learning, exploration, and joyful moments. We have gotten to know each other better, formed new friendships, established our routines, and participated in many fun activities together. We hope everyone has a fantastic break during the holidays and we can't wait to welcome you back in January ready for lots more learning, excitement, and fun!



In literacy, Waterloo class have enjoyed developing their understanding of phonics through a range of activities which strengthen reading, writing, and comprehension skills.



In numeracy, Waterloo class have been focusing on mass and quantity including learning to order height, size, weight and numbers.



In science, Waterloo class have been learning about animal habitats and animal food chains. We have learnt facts about many different environments including rainforest, arctic, desert, and ocean habitats.



In creativity, Waterloo class have really love expressing their imagination and artistry. We have enjoyed colouring, painting, making decorations and messy play including making playdough.



In topic, we have been learning about the various countries that our learners and teaching staff are from. Each week, we have a different 'country of the week' during which we learn lots of interesting facts about the country, listen to some traditional music, and perhaps even try some food!



In PSHE, life skills, and physical wellbeing, Waterloo class have worked on strengthening their functional skills including cooking, personal hygiene, communication, learning to stay hydrated, balance, coordination, participating in group activities and turn-taking, and self-regulation.

I would like to take this time to wish you all a very peaceful and joyful break and I look forward to seeing you all in the New Year.


